# **Grading Rubrics**

## **Constructed-Response Question**

The following rubrics may be useful when scoring *Go Figure?* worksheet questions that are not multiple choice.

### **Two-Point Constructed-Response Rubric**

2	Complete	<ul> <li>The response includes the correct answer.</li> <li>The work or explanation shows an appropriate method of solving the problem.</li> <li>The answer(s) are appropriately labeled.</li> </ul>
1	Partial	<ul> <li>The response provides the correct solution but it is not supported with numbers, words, or pictures as required.</li> <li>The response provides partial evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method; however, the solution is incomplete or slightly flawed.</li> </ul>
0	Inadequate	<ul> <li>The response provides inadequate evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method.</li> <li>The response demonstrates major flaws in reasoning or irrelevant information.</li> </ul>

## Four-Point Constructed-Response Rubric

4	Complete	<ul> <li>The response includes the correct answer.</li> <li>The work or explanation shows an appropriate method of solving the problem.</li> <li>The answer(s) are appropriately labeled.</li> </ul>
3	Clear	The response provides clear evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method; however, the solution may be incomplete or slightly flawed.
2	Partial	<ul> <li>The response provides the correct solution but it is not supported with numbers, words, or pictures as required.</li> <li>The response provides partial evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method; however, the solution is incomplete or slightly flawed</li> </ul>
1	Minimal	• The response provides minimal evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method; however, the solution is incomplete or flawed.
0	Inadequate	<ul> <li>The response provides inadequate evidence of solving the problem using an appropriate method.</li> <li>The response demonstrates major flaws in reasoning or irrelevant information.</li> </ul>
